Happy March as that means we are a bit closer to spring!
The February Council Meeting had a guest speaker as Matt
Wagner from United Church Funds provided our annual review of
our investment account. As of December 31, 2023, the funds in
our investment account were up 16.66% over the previous year.
Matt did not recommend any modifications to our current
strategy as that has served us well so far.



Our church does enjoy a good meal and the results from the Frostbite BBQ were very successful with \$1,200 being raised. The first fish fry was also successful and there is another one scheduled for March 15. The spring chicken dinner is on March 2 and by the time you read this, it will have already occurred. Thanks to all who ate, worked and otherwise made these events a success!

As we are now into March, with hopefully most of the winter weather behind us, do keep in mind to provide the church office any updates to your phone numbers or email addresses in the event church services or events need to be adjusted or cancelled. Updated information is vital to keeping you informed, so please share if something has changed for you.

One of the biggest agenda items the council has been working on is the repair of one of the HVAC units in the Fellowship Hall. The west unit has a cracked heat exchanger and it also required a new blower motor. A special congregational meeting was held on Sunday, February 25th and it was decided to have Baer Heating and Cooling make the repair for a cost not exceeding \$5,000. The bid we received from Baer was \$3,650, so we are looking forward to having that unit up and running as soon as the parts arrive!

A big change in the Clothing Pantry days and hours will be occurring in March. The Clothing Pantry will now be open on Tuesday instead of Monday and hours will also include the opportunity to participate not only in the afternoon, but now with late afternoon and evening hours. This mission is vital to our community, so please volunteer some time if you are able.

The Congregational Life Committee is in the early planning stages of offering a monthly Community Meal at the church. There are churches in our area who have developed a program like this and we are exploring what could work for our church in order to provide a vital service to the community. It would also be a great time for fellowship with friends and the opportunity to meet new folks who may be looking for a church home.

Lastly, we are in the Lenten Season, so please reflect and lift up in prayer those who are experiencing challenges with their health, employment, family or life in general.Let's walk together on our Lenten journey as we approach Easter and reflect on the path Jesus Christ took for us to save us from our sins. Rejoice in the Risen Savior!


